Evaluation – Research has shown that tests are not accurate when measuring children's abilities as they do not understand the concept of testing. We cannot compare one child's score with another. Children develop at different rates therefore we have no formal tests. Teache4r measures children's progress by ongoing observations over the whole year. A child's progress is compared to his/her previous development and not to other children. The child's progress will be recorded by-
